NATIONAL MUSEUM OF TANZANIA AND AFRICAN LIBERATION HERITAGE CENTRE ANNOUNCE STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP TO PRESERVE AND PROMOTE AFRICAN LIBERATION HERITAGE HISTORY

DODOMA, TANZANIA – The National Museum of Tanzania (NMT) and the African Liberation Heritage Centre (ALHC) are pleased to announce a strategic partnership aimed at collaboratively preserving and promoting the rich history of Tanzania's contribution to the African liberation movements. The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was formally signed on September 12, 2025, in Dodoma. This collaboration will focus on joint projects, including new exhibitions, educational programs, and research initiatives.

The signing was a key highlight of recent official engagements in Dodoma and was witnessed by senior government officials, including Mr. Methusela Ntonda, Deputy Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Information, Culture, Arts and Sports.

JOINT PROJECTS TO DRIVE HERITAGE PRESERVATION AND EDUCATION The strategic collaboration will initially focus on the following key areas:

- Research and Conservation of Liberations Heritage Sites Both organizations will collaborate on various research projects and provide technical support for the sustainable conservation of Liberation heritage sites.
- Exhibition: "Tanzania's Role in African Liberation." A major joint exhibition
 will be developed, featuring artifacts, documents, and oral histories collected by
 both institutions. The exhibition will detail Tanzania's pivotal role as a host and
 supporter of various African liberation movements and will be showcased at
 ALHC and NMT branches across the country, starting with Dar es Salaam and
 Dodoma.
- "Legacy of Heroes" Oral History Project. This initiative will launch a
 nationwide project to interview and document the stories of surviving veterans,
 leaders, and supporters of the liberation struggles. The oral histories and
 archival footage will be digitized and made accessible to the public, preserving
 firsthand accounts for future generations.
- Educational Outreach Program. The partnership will create and deliver a
 comprehensive educational outreach program for schools and universities. This
 program will include workshops, seminars, and resource materials to engage
 young Tanzanians with the history of African liberation, fostering a deeper
 understanding of their national and continental heritage.
- Establishment of a Digital Heritage Archive. Both organizations will collaborate on building a centralized digital archive of African liberation heritage. This will allow for easier access to research materials for scholars, students, and the public, positioning Tanzania as a hub for the study of post-colonial history.

LEADERSHIP COMMENTARY

Dr. Noel Biseko Lwoga, Director General of the National Museum of Tanzania, commented on the partnership: "This collaboration with the African Liberation Heritage Centre is a significant step towards fulfilling our mandate to preserve and promote our nation's cultural and historical heritage. By joining forces, we can ensure the vital stories of Africa's liberation are not only remembered but are actively shared with the world through compelling exhibitions and educational programs."

Mr. Christopher Muhongole, Coordinator of the African Liberation Heritage Centre, added: "Partnering with the National Museum of Tanzania allows us to leverage their extensive institutional network and expertise. Together, we can create more impactful and accessible projects that honor the sacrifices made for freedom and independence across Africa."
